



Dangerous Goods Handling US0409



Dangerous goods refers to any materials or products that need special care when being handled and stored. Different types of material require different care and knowing how to handle these goods is fundamentally important to a Warehouse Practitioner. This course explains the different codes, the handling requirements for these codes, and the storage and transportation requirements for different types of dangerous and hazardous goods.
